First of all, they were stereotyped as being a rather "rough crowd" with a poor reputation. The stereotypical biker is aware of being looked down on or snubbed simply because of his mode of transportation. Shepherds were considered unreliable. I think the general feeling of the time was that they were OK to tend your sheep, but you wouldn't want your daughter to marry one of them.

Go, and share the love of Jesus. Be a blessing! Don't miss any opportunity to make an impact on the world. No matter what your abilities or gifts are, Jesus will use them to reach people for Him.

It is my prayer that you have trusted in the One who came to purchase our salvation. If not, during this Advent/Christmas season would be an excellent time to ask him into your heart and life.
